Reference a quotation in your text when you **haven't** seen the original. This **INDIRECT CITATION** uses the abbreviation **qtd** for the word **QUOTED**.

Smith notes that "left handed people are very smart..." (qtd. in Hood 369)

A few changes:

- ☛ Titles of entire works now appear in italics. You do NOT have to underline those titles.
- ☛ If you identify the database, you don't need to include the URL for the item.
- ☛ Always include the format (Web, Print, CD, etc.).

*Start each citation's first line at left margin.

*Indent second & following lines one tab.

*Use the punctuation in the models.
